School Start Times

School start times have always been a topic of conversation. In light of recent articles about teenagers not getting enough sleep, this topic was once again discussed. Options are to switch start times having the elementary students starting school earlier (which Iowa City has just implemented) or all schools starting at the same time. What are the barriers to having all students starting at the same time – bussing (enough buses, elementary students on the bus with secondary students), athletic schedules, having young students waiting for the bus in the dark, etc. This topic will be on upcoming Ed Programs agendas to provide more data on a monthly basis.

District School Improvement Leadership Team Structure

Mr. Rheingans distributed the proposed D/SILT membership, including parents, teachers, building administrators, students, Forum administration, and community representatives for a total of 52 members. He recommends meeting three times per year in November, February and April. Meetings will be held in the evenings from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. Iowa Code is specific as to the requirements of a school improvement committee.
